Lauded With Multiple Construction Industry Awards

Salt Lake City, UT – 26 January 2009 – Staker Parson Companies received several awards at the Utah Associated General Contractors (AGC) Annual Awards Breakfast on Saturday, 24 January 2009. The Utah Associated General Contractors association is Utah's largest construction association representing members throughout Utah and in nearly all facets of non-residential construction.

The company won the \$10M+ Rural Highway Project of the Year for its work on SR-30 Valley View Highway Project. This project was completed early saving commuters countless hours of delay between Cache and Box Elder Counties in Northern Utah.

JBP is a leading supplier of ready mixed concrete throughout northern Utah and southeastern Idaho.
