OLDCASTLE RECEIVES APPROVAL FOR DEVELOPMENT OF GREENFIELD SITE

ATLANTA—Two years ago the announcement was made in the Camak community of Warren County, Ga., to build a state-of-the-art rock crushing and rail load-out facility. Full approvals have been granted and development has begun at the 1,200 acre site, 100 miles east of Atlanta. The plant and rail construction will occur over the next 12 to 16 months with full operational capacity in early 2012. The operation will employ between 20 to 30 equipment operators and maintenance personnel.

Stakeholder support for the proposed project has been favorable. Since 2008, APAC-Mid South and Conrad Yelvington Distributors, Inc., both Oldcastle Materials companies, have communicated openly with regulators, local government, civic organizations, Camak Chamber of Commerce, residents and neighbors of the site. “Working closely with the community early in the process to identify questions and concerns has given us the opportunity to incorporate their input into our plans. It has produced a win-win situation for all. Proceeding under the company-wide Oldcastle Materials corporate social responsibility commitment positions the project for success and business growth to the mutual benefit of all stakeholders,” said Seán O’Sullivan, president, APAC-Mid South.

“The region is rich in natural resources and has a long history of rock quarries and various other mining operations. This is an ideal location for the company to expand its current operations. We have approached the community in an open and honest way and communicated often, which has been well received. As a result, we are proceeding on schedule without costly delays or disruption caused by public concern,” said Brent Ward, project manager.

Numerous community-wide events to provide project status updates and continue building relationships have occurred since the March 2008 announcement. Most recently in July, a community meeting was held with more than 50 residents, neighbors, community leaders, local and Georgia State elected officials.
